

WHEREAS; the state of Wisconsin acknowledges the many physical and mental health benefits of breastfeeding for babies and their mothers, and promotes inclusive support for every family, regardless of race, ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, education level, socioeconomic status, or any other factor that makes every family and community unique; and

WHEREAS; breastfeeding is a public health imperative and proven primary prevention strategy, which is why breastfeeding exclusively for the first six months of a child's life when feasible, with continued breastfeeding for two years or beyond, is recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics to optimize infant health, growth, and development; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS), local health departments, and Tribal organizations throughout Wisconsin promote and support breastfeeding as the optimal method of infant feeding through nutrition programs such as the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children; and

WHEREAS; we recognize that we must continue working to reduce barriers and address discrimination in communities, healthcare systems, and employment settings to ensure that individuals and families who choose to breastfeed their child have the opportunity to do so; and


