

WHEREAS; the Purple Heart is an American military decoration that was first established as the Badge of Military Merit by President George Washington on August 7, 1782, during his leadership as General of the Continental Army in the Revolutionary War; and

WHEREAS; since World War I, the Purple Heart has been awarded directly or posthumously to members of the United States Armed Forces who have been wounded or killed either in armed conflict, while being held as prisoners of war, or as otherwise designated by the president; and

WHEREAS; the Purple Heart may also be awarded to American civil or foreign service employees wounded or killed while attached to a military unit performing intelligence, counterterrorism, or other duties; and

WHEREAS; the Purple Heart is the oldest American military award that continues to be issued, and is one of the oldest military decorations in the world; and

WHEREAS; this year marks the 240th anniversary of the Purple Heart award and the 90th anniversary of the Military Order of the Purple Heart; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin honors all Purple Heart recipients and their families for their selflessness and sacrifice in service to our country;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,

PURPLE HEART DAY


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
