Proclamation

WHEREAS; it is estimated that, nationally, over \$11 billion is lost due to employee turnover and upwards of \$550 billion is lost due to employee disengagement each year; and

WHEREAS; according to data collected by Gallup, nearly 70 percent of employees are disengaged at work in the United States, and 80 percent of employees are disengaged at work worldwide; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin is committed to growing the workforce of the future, and is determined to attract and retain graduates from our state's top colleges and universities as part of this mission, as well as to break down barriers to employment that might otherwise keep qualified employees from fully engaging in the workforce; and

WHEREAS; founded by a group of Madison-based entrepreneurs in 2018, CultureCon has brought hundreds of thought leaders and progressive businesses from around the country to Madison for a premiere conference experience dedicated entirely to company culture and employee engagement; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin celebrates the mission of CultureCon and wishes all organizers and attendees of CultureCon 2022 a successful event;
