WHEREAS; although the five-year survival rate for childhood cancer has risen in recent decades, it is estimated that one in six of our nation's kids loses their battle with cancer within five years of diagnosis and childhood cancer survivors often face at least one chronic health condition later in life; and

WHEREAS; the causes of childhood cancer are still largely unknown, and further research is needed in order to better understand and determine how to tailor treatments to the unique needs of children; and

WHEREAS; it is our goal as a state and country to enhance the ability of kids to survive and thrive following a cancer diagnosis, and to improve the quality of life of kids and their families; and

WHEREAS; symbolized by the color gold, Childhood Cancer Awareness Month presents all Wisconsinites and all people with the opportunity to recognize and support kids and families affected by childhood cancer, as well as childhood cancer initiatives, organizations, and hospitals; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins all kids and families affected by childhood cancer across our state, along with the healthcare professionals who dedicate their lives to caring for them, in spreading awareness of childhood cancer and embracing hope for earlier diagnoses, improved treatments, and a cure;
