WHEREAS; addressing the complex medical needs of individuals born with lissencephaly early in life and helping families successfully provide care is imperative to supporting their overall long-term health and well-being; and

WHEREAS; further research, education, awareness, and support for families of individuals affected by lissencephaly are needed to ensure every individual and family can live their best and fullest lives; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins dedicated individuals and organizations across our state and country, including the Lissencephaly Foundation, in supporting all individuals with lissencephaly, their families and caregivers, and advocates through continued efforts to empower families and educate communities;
