

WHEREAS; Wisconsin is home to two species of cranes, the whooping crane—a federally endangered species—and the sandhill crane; and

WHEREAS; while the whooping crane disappeared from Wisconsin in the 1900s, restoration efforts in recent years have led to the birth of whooping cranes in the wild once more; and

WHEREAS; the sandhill crane was similarly endangered in the 1800s, but the population was restored following the passage of the 1916 Federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act and the designation of a central area in Wisconsin for their breeding; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin’s cranes inhabit wetlands and marshes, and contribute to our state’s ecosystem by eating insects or rodents that would otherwise damage crops; and

WHEREAS; headquartered in Baraboo, the International Crane Foundation is dedicated to saving threatened cranes worldwide and sustaining the habitats on which they depend; and

WHEREAS; the International Crane Foundation works with communities to improve the livelihood and well-being of those who share their land with cranes, supports conservation leaders, and hosts thousands of visitors, of all ages, at their Cranes of the World experience every year; and

WHEREAS; for nearly 50 years, the International Crane Foundation has supported conservation efforts with an international network of leaders, playing a leading role in the return of both species of cranes to our state; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins the International Crane Foundation in encouraging all Wisconsinites to reflect on the importance of cranes in our state and to contribute to conservation efforts;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim September 18, 2021, as

SAVING CRANES DAY


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
