

WHEREAS; pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndromes (PANS) and pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections (PANDAS) are serious inflammatory brain conditions; and

WHEREAS; children with PANS and PANDAS generally experience the onset of three or more symptoms—including obsessive-compulsive disorder, tics, restricted eating, emotional lability, depression, irritability, aggression, oppositional behaviors, behavioral regression, deterioration in handwriting, loss of math skills, sensory or motor abnormalities, sleep disturbances, enuresis, and urinary frequency—which can cause severe physical and emotional distress; and

WHEREAS; because PANS and PANDAS affect every individual differently, children with the condition are far too often left undiagnosed, untreated, or undertreated, which can have very serious consequences for them and their families, including suicide; and

WHEREAS; although treatment can be as simple as generic antibiotics or over-the-counter anti-inflammatories, a lack of awareness often leads to the misdiagnosis or failure to diagnose of many children suffering from PANS and PANDAS; and



PANS/PANDAS AWARENESS MONTH


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
