
STATE of WISCONSIN

WHEREAS; Wisconsin women like Bessica Raiche of Beloit, who, in 1910 was credited by the Aeronautical Society as being the first woman to fly an airplane in a solo flight, have also made their mark on the aviation world; and

WHEREAS; although women are dramatically underrepresented in the aviation industry, the number of women involved has steadily increased in the last two decades; and


WHEREAS; the state of Wisconsin is committed to expanding opportunity for young people throughout the state and recognizes the importance of increasing women's participation in aviation fields; and
