
## STATE of WISCONSIN



WHEREAS; hemp has origins dating back thousands of years and is considered one of the oldest cultivated fiber crops in the world; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin was one of the nation's leading producers of hemp in the first half of the twentieth century, even producing fiber for the federal government to utilize during the World Wars; and

WHEREAS; the 2014 Farm Bill authorized Wisconsin to create an Industrial Hemp Research Pilot Program in 2018 that issued about 245 grower licenses and 100 processor licenses in its first year; and

WHEREAS; the passage of the 2018 Farm Bill removed hemp from the federal Controlled Substances Act and thus created a monumental shift in the opportunities for growth and production of hemp in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; interest in hemp production in Wisconsin skyrocketed in 2019 with grower and processor licenses increasing more than six-fold to approximately 2,100 licensees total; and

WHEREAS; growers and processors alike are excited about hemp's potential in agriculture, textiles, recycling and bioplastics, food and beverages, construction and industrial materials, and personal care products, among others; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin recognizes and celebrates its long, storied, and proud history of pioneering research, education, innovation, and industrialization of hemp; and

WHEREAS; the state welcomes a new era of hemp growing, processing and product development that will once again place Wisconsin as a national leader in the hemp industry;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the state of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim October 18, 2019, as
