

WHEREAS; Wisconsin's emergency responders work tirelessly to save lives and keep the state's highways safe, responding to approximately 134,700 traffic crashes statewide every year; and

WHEREAS; at every crash scene, emergency responders—representing fire, law enforcement, emergency medical services, and towing and transportation services—are at risk of being struck and injured, or even killed, in a secondary crash; and

WHEREAS; all drivers have a responsibility to drive safely and take every precaution to reduce the risk of secondary crashes, which includes following the state's Move Over Law, designed to provide a safety zone for workers on the side of roadways; and

WHEREAS; 2021 Wisconsin Act 115 added additional protections for workers on Wisconsin's roads by creating a criminal penalty for traffic violations that lead to injuries in defined emergency zones; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins the Wisconsin Department of Transportation in encouraging all Wisconsinites to learn more about highway crash safety and to recognize the hard work of the state's emergency responders;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
