WHEREAS; the attack on Pearl Harbor marked the United States' entrance into World War II and, today, more than 5,800 World War II veterans live in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; each year, Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day is recognized in Wisconsin and throughout the United States to commemorate those who lost their lives in the attack and to honor our veterans and servicemembers who have fought to preserve and defend the freedoms and quality of life enjoyed by folks across our country; and

WHEREAS; 2020 marks the 79th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor, and presents an opportunity for all Wisconsinites to honor the sacrifices made by our country's servicemembers; and


WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins servicemembers, civilians, and veterans groups across the United States in remembrance of those who lost their lives on December 7, 1941, and in gratitude for the sacrifices of all those who continue to protect and defend our country each and every day;
