

WHEREAS; WHEREAS; on December 13, 1636, the first organized militia regiments in North America were established in the Massachusetts Bay Colony, marking the symbolic birth of the United States National Guard; and

WHEREAS; the United States National Guard maintains a standing army of citizen soldiers and airmen in every state, the District of Columbia, and most territories, with troops ready to be deployed at any time to provide critical support in communities across the country and abroad in response to natural disasters and other crises of local, national, and international concern; and

WHEREAS; administered by the National Guard Bureau, the Wisconsin National Guard is Wisconsin's branch of the United States National Guard, composed of the Wisconsin Army National Guard and the Wisconsin Air National Guard; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin National Guard was established on March 5, 1837, when the people of the then-Wisconsin Territory began forming what would become the Wisconsin State Militia upon the founding of the state in 1848 and the Wisconsin Branch of the United States National Guard in 1879; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Army National Guard is comprised of approximately 7,700 soldiers based out of four major commands in Camp Douglas, Madison, Milwaukee, and Fort McCoy, while the Wisconsin Air National Guard is composed of approximately 2,300 members based out of Camp Douglas, Madison, and Milwaukee; and

WHEREAS; since its founding, members of the Wisconsin National Guard have been deployed on innumerable missions, both state and federal, with the lineage of some battalions still tracing their roots to the 1st and 2nd Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry Regiments in the Civil War; and

WHEREAS; members of the Wisconsin National Guard have made invaluable contributions throughout the history of the state and country, including through the role they have played in the state's response to the coronavirus pandemic during the largest sustained domestic mobilization in the Guard's history; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin commends the Wisconsin National Guard and all its members for their selflessness and sacrifice in service to the health, safety, security, and well-being of all Wisconsinites and all Americans and congratulates the United States National Guard on 386 years of exemplary service;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim December 13 2022 as the
