
## STATE of WISCONSIN

WHEREAS; some of the most common vision disorders among children include nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism, and amblyopia; and

WHEREAS; according to the American Optometric Association, nearly 80% of learning occurs through visual activities, and undiagnosed vision problems have the potential to significantly impede the learning process; and

WHEREAS; every kid deserves the opportunity to learn and to achieve their full potential; and

WHEREAS; it is important to be able to identify common symptoms of vision disorders – like frequent headaches, continuous squinting, blinking and rubbing of the eyes, and feeling dizzy or nauseous – as kids don't often realize they are experiencing vision issues; and

WHEREAS; raising public awareness about learning-related vision problems is necessary to ensure that young people receive the prompt vision treatment they need to enhance their lives;
